The members present constituted a quorum. Also present were David Ruth (Treasurer), Latasha Van Norman (Clerk), and Lt. Smith of the Normandy Police Department, Melinda Stewart (Code Enforcement).

ADDITIONS OR SUBTRACTIONS TO THE AGENDA

Sharon Briggen is sponsoring this year's holiday decorating contest. She is requesting two judges to judge competition. Although there is not a set date for application and judging period, there will be more information available in the Greensheets and eblast reminders will be sent to all residents up until the end of judgment period. Reports

Normandy Police

Lt. Smith's reported from 9/19/2017 to 10/17/2017 there have been 24 citations issued and a total of 24 calls for service. One written report submitted. See report. Ald. Trojcak asked about old pending reports, he said will look into it and get back with her.

Code Enforcement

Melinda Stewart reported more vandalism at the park; a letter was sent to residents with children explaining to parents and home owners they will be held accountable for the children's actions. There was also a mention of the lock on the gate being broken off. Because the gate does not belong to Greendale it was reported to St. Louis County Parks and there will be follow-up within the next couple of weeks. See attached report.

Emergency Management

The committee has been corresponding with Chief Mahoney about safety training classes. Although it is unclear what kind of training will be available the committee would like to come up with a date to have training class. A date has not been scheduled for meeting to discuss details. Ald. Trojczak wants accurate details of training class when information becomes available.

Forestry Advisory Committee

During the month of September the FAC committee provided 37 hours of volunteer work. The committee met on Sep 27 with all members present. They are requesting twelve trees from Forest Releaf for fall planting. The annual fall tree inspection has begun to check for maintenance needs. Findings will be discussed at their next meeting. Normandy Schools

Ald. Trojczak attended a DESE meeting on September 20. She learned Normandy Schools Collaborative has 30 service providers and over half of them provide help regularly. **Forestry Advisory Committee Report
October 17, 2017**

The committee met on September 27 with all members present.

We are requesting twelve trees from Forest ReLeaf for fall planting; we hope to get at least three but preferably four different species to continue building species diversity in the city. Our contact with Forest ReLeaf is Alderperson Garhart; she will keep the committee updated on species availability.

Members are beginning the annual fall tree inspection to check for trimming, structural pruning, deadwooding and other maintenance needs. We will discuss the findings at our next meeting.

Alderperson Trojcak is investigating additional companies for future tree trimming and removal needs.

Our next meeting is scheduled for Wednesday, October 25 at 6:30 pm.

Normandy Schools Collaborative Report

10-17-17

I attended the Schools' meeting by DESE Sept. 20 and learned that the NSC has over 30 service providers helping. Over $\frac{2}{3}$ of these provide help on a regular basis. Five service entities were listed under UMSEL: namely, Bridge, Edge Clinic & Van, College of Nursing (a practicum student), Community Outreach and Fine Arts. Only Bridge provided "regular" involvement, nursing involvement was blank, and "infrequent" was shown for the other three organizations.

Dr. Pearson's presentation focused mainly on test scores and was difficult to follow. The small group sessions were also difficult to follow and ran out of time.
