Shakespeare in the Streets: Love At the River's Edge



This year's Shakespeare in the Streets event will take place at the 24:1 Cafe on Page. *Love at the River's Edge*, the latest work from Shakespeare Festival St. Louis' internationally recognized Shakespeare in the Streets initiative, will open on Friday, September 13, 2019.

The world premiere is based on Shakespeare's *As You Like It* and is the culmination of a year's work in Calhoun County, Illinois and north St. Louis County, Missouri. It is part of Shakespeare Festival's ongoing work to bridge the urban-rural divide and elevate the voices of Midwest artists and residents.

Love at the River's Edge opens with one of Shakespeare's most famous lines, "All the world's a stage, and all the men and women merely players." The players are Midwestern families and their journey of love, community and reconciliation will take audience members from Pagedale, MO to Calhoun County, IL.

The performances will begin at 7 p.m. outside the 24:1 Coffee House/Cafe at the intersection of Page and Ferguson (you may want to bring a lawn chair). After Act 1, the cast and audience will journey together by bus (provided by the festival) and on the Golden Eagle Ferry from north St. Louis County, and across the river to Calhoun County. The second act of the production will take place on the riverbank with the Mississippi River as the backdrop. The entire experience including travel will take approximately three hours. Learn the Latest Info on Alzheimer's at Free Event



Saint Louis University and the Alzheimer's Foundation of America are presenting a free seminar about Alzheimer's disease and memory issues in older adults that is open to the public. The event is from 9 a.m. to 12:30 p.m. Thursday, September 19 at Busch Student Center.

"This will be a great chance to get up-to-date on the latest knowledge about Alzheimer's disease and approaches to treatment," said John Morley, M.D.,

adjunct professor of geriatrics at SLU.

The session includes a memory screening, talk on causes and treatments for Alzheimer's disease, tips for caregivers and a panel discussion that offers strategies for creating a team of professionals to provide wrap-around care for someone who has Alzheimer's. A geriatrician, social worker and occupational therapist are among the health care professionals who will present.

September is National Preparedness Month

St. Louis County Office of Emergency Management NOW recommends that all residents prepare to sustain their household for at least 96 hours (four days) in the event of a natural or man-made disaster. It may take several days before first responders can assist you or the community.

WHAT CAN YOU DO?

1. MAKE a PLAN

Discuss your emergency plan with family and friends: Who to call? Where to meet?

2. PREPARE a KIT

Check your emergency supplies: flashlights, food, water, medicine, cash, documents, etc.

3. LISTEN to INFORMATION

Use weather radio, download weather apps, and tune in to television and radio stations.

**Field Services Team —Boots on the Ground Responder
(BOG-R)**

Description: If deemed safe, Team members will visually assess **assigned** areas to determine if residents and properties have been impacted by events such as storms and, and power outages, etc. Members may be asked to assist with other emergency responses that can include door-to-door notifications, evacuations, and traffic management, etc. Two or more participants from each street and block are needed to have an effective Team. Be a **BOG-R**.

September 19

Health Team (HT) (Medical and Mental Health)

Description: A trained Health Care Professional will serve as Team Leader. The primary focus of the TEAM is to assist residents in the event a triage area is set-up. Members may want to explore promoting health related activities can help residents to be prepared to respond to an emergency event. Free training opportunities will be available: First Aid, Stop the Bleed, CPR, etc.

September 26

Compassion Assistance Services Team (CAST)

Description: The CAST member will be assigned a small number of residents to check-on periodically, especially during times of heat and cold weather alerts and emergencies. Contact will be primarily through phone calls. The City will attempt to identify residents who may need contact.

October 1

Communication and Technology Team (CTT)

Description: Providing information for residents is imperative before and after an emergency/disaster. General activities of the CTT will be to help prepare Emergency Preparedness Messages and Tips for the monthly Greensheet, prepare informational flyers, and develop contact list. In the event of a community emergency designated team members will assist the Leadership Team (Mayor and Communication Leader -PIO) with preparing information for dissemination.
