This is why she is proud to call Greendale her family’s home. It’s the perfect place to raise her 11-year old son, Joe, quiet enough to enjoy a read outside, and close enough to get her fix of strawberries from Thies Farm. Raised in Covington, LA, Buell moved to St. Louis to attend Washington University. She found herself working in fundraising, and then eventually at the custom fragrance shop, Make Scents, which she ended up buying out. Though she changed the name to Cassie’s Scents, 15 years later, she still offers over 150 fragrances to mix and make custom scents that can be infused into moisturizers, roller balls, or cologne sprays. She also has curated many other items for customers to fall in love with, including Root candles, seasonal items, and quirky socks. It’s the perfect place to grab a last-minute gift, but make it look like you didn’t forget, because she also carries a selection of greeting cards and gift bags in the back of the store.

Up until last year, Buell’s business was located in the Central West End, but is now at 8837 Ladue Rd. in Colonial Marketplace, near the Original Pancake House. Postponements and Cancellations Abound As Region Tries To Quell COVID-19



Everything in the world seems to be on hold as leaders everywhere try to “flatten the curve” and keep the coronavirus from spreading. We’ve seen virtually every in-person gathering, from school, to weddings and sporting events cancelled as a result of the virus.

Jury duty has been cancelled and municipal courts have suspended proceedings through April 17th. The **April 7th election, has been postponed until June 2nd. And the tax filing deadline is now July 15th.**

Greendale has postponed its Annual Arbor Day Celebration, usually held in April. A date will be announced later down the line.

2020 Census: Your Response Matters. Everyone Counts

For the first time ever, you’ll be able to respond to the Census online, by phone, or by mail. By now, you should have received an invitation in the mail to participate in a survey for the 2020 census. The census happens every 10 years and provides an official count of the U.S. population and information about important demographic changes over a decade. The data collected helps determine the distribution of federal funding to states for numerous programs that help our communities:

- Medicaid, school lunches, and SNAP
- Roads, bridges, hospitals and schools
- After-school programs and community health centers



Everyone counts.

The census counts every single person in the U.S. It’s your civic duty. Completing the census is mandatory; it’s a way to participate in our democracy and say “I count!”

It’s about fair representation.

Every 10 years, the results of the census are used to reapportion the House of Representatives.

It’s in the constitution.

The U.S. Constitution mandates that everyone in the country be counted every 10 years.

It’s about redistricting.

After each decade’s census, state officials redraw the boundaries of the congressional and state legislative districts in their states to account for population shifts.

Your privacy matters.

When you respond to the census, your answers are kept anonymous. They are used only to produce statistics. The U.S. Census Bureau is bound by law to protect your answers and keep them strictly confidential. The law ensures that your private information is never published and that your answers cannot be used against you by any government agency or court.

Shape your future. Start here.

Our community has a lot to gain when we all respond to the census. So make an impact by participating in the 2020 census. When we all come together, anything is possible. Watch your mail for details or take action at www.2020census.gov.
